NRW community,

The North Rose-Wolcott Central School District was informed this morning that a North Rose-Wolcott High School student has tested positive for COVID-19. The district also learned late last night that a member of our Middle School community has tested positive for COVID-19.

The district continues to work with the Wayne County Department of Health (DOH) to ensure we take all necessary steps to support the health and safety of our school community.

At this time, we will continue with instruction under the hybrid model for our middle school students through the remainder of the week. High school students are already learning remotely through December 22. Students in all grades are scheduled to learn remotely on Monday, December 21 and Tuesday, December 22, with in-person instruction set to resume on Monday, January 4, 2021 following the district's winter recess.

We continue to monitor the situation in collaboration with the health department and will communicate with families if further action is required on the part of our district.

Through the process of contact tracing, the DOH will direct close contacts to quarantine if necessary. The DOH will directly contact any families or staff if additional action is required. If you have not been contacted by the DOH, no additional actions are required.

As a reminder, please monitor for signs and symptoms of COVID-19 and call your regular health care provider if you develop symptoms. For a complete list of symptoms, visit the CDC website at www.cdc.gov/coronavirus. Symptoms usually appear within 2-14 days from the last day of exposure. Please continue to practice good hand hygiene, wear face coverings in public, maintain a 6-foot distance from others, and avoid large gatherings.

We continue to work with the DOH to ensure the safety of our students, staff and families during this time. The health and wellness of our NRW community is our primary concern.
